“Reading Together Strategy”

Echo Reading: Using an early reader book the parent reads a sentence first and points to each word. The child becomes the echo, reading the sentence back to the parent and pointing to each word.

Choral Reading: Using an early reader book the parent reads aloud slowly and the child reads along with their parent. The child and parent should be looking and pointing to the text while reading.

When I Don't Know a Word:

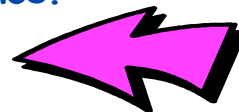
*Look at the picture



*Tap and get your mouth ready to make the first sound.



*Skip the word, continue to read the sentence.
Go back and reread again.



*Think about what is happening in the story. What word is missing that begins with that sound and makes sense in the story? Are there any clues in the pictures that help?
